BACKGROUND and EXECUTIVE SUMMARY

Bike to Work Day has been held annually in the Washington metropolitan region for over two decades and was originally started by the Washington Area Bicyclist Association (WABA) with a rallying point or "pit stop: in downtown DC. In September 2000, The National Capital Region Transportation Board's (TPB's) Commuter Connections program, housed at the Metropolitan Washington Council of Governments, partnered with WABA to form a regional Bike to Work Day Steering Committee to examine the feasibility of adding additional Bike to Work Day pit stops throughout the region. In 2001, the expanded event created a greater awareness of using cycling to work as a viable commuting alternative. Since the first regional Bike to Work Day in 2001, annual registrations have grown exponentially over the years. In 2020, Bike to Work Day was canceled due to the COVID pandemic, reinstated in 2021, and is gradually looking to rebound to pre-COVID levels. The 2024 Bike to Work Day event had a total of 13,972 registrants.

Several bicycles were raffled off and participants enjoyed free T-shirts, snacks, prize drawings, and engaged with elected officials.

The marketing campaign relied upon targeting of employer and commuter audiences, identification of cost-effective media, crafting key messages, and procuring t-shirts designed to attract commuters to try bicycling to work.


The Steering Committee's resources for Bike to Work Day 2024, included:

- Web site designed and maintained by Commuter Connections.
- Posters and rack cards developed and printed by Commuter Connections.
- Promoting the event through WABA's membership.
- > A comprehensive marketing campaign produced and placed by Commuter Connections.
- Outreach to employers through a direct mail and email marketing campaign by Commuter Connections.
- ➤ An article in the Commuter Connections employer newsletter.
- Local marketing efforts by the various pit stop managers.
- ➤ An e-mail to previous year's participants by Commuter Connections.
- > Banners designed and artwork provided by Commuter Connections.
- A public affairs outreach effort through the Metropolitan Washington Council of Governments Office of Communications and WABA.
- The design and distribution of free t-shirts by Commuter Connections.
- Donated bicycles for the regional raffle from Al's Bike Shop, BicycleSPACE, and Bikes@Vienna, Handy Bikes, and Terrapin Bicycles.

In addition, 9 confirmed bicycling convoys with route leaders assisted novice and experienced cyclists. Each route traveled to a pit stop where cyclists received free refreshments, T-shirts and other giveaways. Many pit stops had additional activities for bicyclists and are described later in this report.

Since 2000, the COG/TPB's Commuter Connections program has worked to increase awareness of bicycling to work as a viable commute option by joining with WABA in their efforts to promote and coordinate the region's annual Bike to Work Day event. Commuter Connections created and maintained a regional marketing effort that helped to increase the number of cyclists participating in the yearly event from 1,100 in 2001 to a peak of more than 18,000 in 2017. Although biking to work accounts for a small percentage of the overall regional commute mode split, bicycling helps reduce traffic congestion, improves air quality, and provides a healthy commute alternative for those commuters who choose to use it as a sustainable means of transportation to and from work.

Registration by Year







Alexandria: Staff from the City of Alexandria's Office of Mobility Services greeted more than 200 cyclists at Old City Hall on Bike to Work Day on May 17, 2024 between 7am-10am. The weather was cool and overcast. The pit stop was a party-like atmosphere, with twelve staff and volunteers managing the event logistics. After checking in, receiving swag bags, and selecting their T-shirts, participants were offered:

- Bottled water, coffee, tea, bananas, oranges, and an assortment of pre-packaged grab and go snacks,
- Ten tents representing area businesses and City services,
- Bike tune-ups,
- Music with a DJ,
- 25 raffle prizes, and
- DASH bike loading demonstrations.

The event had the support of the local community with two bike shops participating by offering bike checks, coffee, tea, and snacks donated by local businesses. The Alexandria Economic Development Partnership (AEDP) generously agreed to MC the event, community organizations such as Alexandria BPAC and WABA shared biking information, and local businesses donated more than \$1200 in raffle prizes and donations.

Staff secured special guest speakers including Justin Wilson, Mayor, City of Alexandria, MWCOG Executive Director, Clark Mercer, and MWCOG Transportation Operations Program Director, Dan Sheehan and BPAC representative, Ken Notis.

To encourage participation, Bike to Work Day was publicized in variety of ways: news releases, social media posts, a website article, communication with employers, and street team distribution of posters, flyers, rack cards. Bike to Work Day registration was promoted at in-person events in late April and early May. The event was also publicized through the Visit Alexandria and Economic Development Partnership newsletters.

During the event, staff captured still photos for use in social media and other communications materials.

Alexandria Del Ray: The event was held at Colasanto Park from 6am to 9am. There were 175 registrants for the pit stop.

Alexandria Eisenhower Square: Eisenhower Square Pit Stop Recap- This year was our 1st year for Bike to Work Day. We had about 45 people register for our pit stop. We had giveaways and snacks for our participants that stopped by. We did the pit stop without any sponsors this year as we are still learning and got a late start. We didn't run out of T-shirts but did have requests for more mediums than we had. Our event was from 7am-9am.

Alexandria Fairlington: There were 55 registrants for the event's pit stop.

Alexandria Mark Center: There were 77 registrants for the event's pit stop.

Alexandria National Landing at APTA: At least 50 Bike to Workday participants at APTA Pit Stop and 4 additional staff volunteers: MET – 96 participants registered for 2024 APTA pit stop and successfully secured 4 staff volunteers.

Anacostia: The event was held by the Arts Center from 7am to 9 am. There were 61 registrants for the pit stop.

Anacostia Riverwalk Trail: The event was held from 7am to 9am. There were 97 registrants. It was a great morning as always! Leesburg: After several rainy days in Leesburg, the weather was pleasant and clear for Bike to Work Day 2024. A team from Loudoun County Transit and Commuter Services distributed orange T-shirts and giveaways to 149 Bike to Work Day participants between 6:30 and 9:00 a.m. at Raflo Park.

Lorton: The event was held 3pm - 7pm at the Workhouse Arts Center in Lorton, VA. There were 17 registered and 20 attended.

Manassas VRE: There were 69 registrants for the event's pit stop.

Manassas Park VRE: The Manassas Park pitstop had 21 visitors at the VRE station where we were set up. VRE and the Prince William Department of Transportation sent out people and swag to give out. We had School Board Member Stacy Seiberling stop by on her bike. It was a great event!

Manassas GMU: There were 38 registrants for the event's pit stop.

McLean - MITRE: The event was held from 6:30am to 9am. There were 122 registrants.

Merrifield - Mosaic: The Mosaic Bike to Work Day Pit Stop featured 16 partners who provided activities, food and drinks, giveaways, and raffle items. We engaged with more than 350 people at Strawberry Park, with the goal of celebrating new and current bicyclists and informing more people in the community about bicycling and active transportation. We leveraged 2024's Bike to Work Day color to create an 80s/90s retro theme for the pit stop with themed photo ops, candy, giveaways, and more. Mt. Rainier: The Mount Rainier Green Team and Mt. Rainier Bicycle Co-op hosted a BtWD pit stop for the fourth year in a row. The pit stop is located at the Mt. Rainier Bicycle Co-op at 36th St. and Bunker Hill Rd. and is staffed by volunteers from the Co-op, the Green Team, and the community. In 2024, we had approximately 30 people stop by to pick up their shirts and enjoy snacks.

Mt. Vernon – Belle View (VA): The event was held at Mount Vernon Rec Center from 6:30am to 9:00am. There were 44 registrants for the pit stop.

Mt. Vernon: The event was held at VIDA Fitness from 6:30am to 9:00am. There were 102 registrants for the pit stop.

Naval Support Activity: The event was held from 6am to 9am. There were 101 registrants for the pit stop.

National Geographic Society: The event was held from 8am to 10am. There were 148 registrants.

Newington: The event was held at South and C Streets SE from 6:30am to 9am. There were 24 registrants for the pit stop.

NIH: The event was held from 7am to 9:30am. There were 268 registrants.

NOMA: The event was held at Wunder Garten from 7:30am to 9:30am. There were 401 registrants for the pit stop.

North Bethesda: On Bike to Work Day, the North Bethesda Pit Stop and the North Bethesda TMD staff eagerly welcomed cyclists and participants at our location at Pike & Rose. The pit stop was located in the parking lot next to Bark Social and behind Pinstripes. Each registered participant received a Bike to Work Day t-shirt, towel, bike maps, and other goodies. They were treated to a variety of breakfast foods, giveaways, and information provided by our great sponsors who attended – Bender JCC of Greater Washington, Bethesda Green, Call Your Mother Deli, Montgomery County Ride On, Office of Home Energy Programs, Onelife Fitness, Pike District, Pike

District Partnership, REI, Strathmore/AMP by Strathmore, and WABA. Additional giveaways were generously donated by Central Farm Markets and Just Ice Tea. A very special thank you to our host, Pike & Rose, for all the support!

Prizes, drawings, and "sponsor spotlights" were made every 15 minutes and music was provided throughout the event. Cyclists participated in various fun contests as well. Techs from REI performed checks on participants' bicycles.

Montgomery County Council Vice President Kate Stewart brought greetings from the Montgomery County council. She also spoke about the importance of bicycling in Montgomery County. The grand prize was a bicycle, from REI. Council Vice President Stewart and REI staff helped with the drawing and congratulated the lucky winner. A second bicycle, also from REI, was awarded to another lucky winner after the event. Another successful year was enjoyed at the North Bethesda at Pike & Rose pit stop!

Oakton: The event was held at the Oak Mar RECenter from 6:30am to 9:00am. There were 24 registrants for the pit stop.

Old City Market and Oven: The event was held on the corner of 6th and K Streets NE from 7am to 9am. There were 105 registrants for the pit stop.

Oxon Hill: The pit stop was operated by the Prince George's County Planning Department of the Maryland-National Capital Park and Planning Commission. Michael Jackson, the pit stop manager was assisted by Leah Daniels, Evan Tenenbaum, Scott Rowe, and Thomas Burke. Deborah Topcik, Director of Marketing at National Harbor, provided promotional assistance prior to the event and was present to provide giveaways and information about National Harbor. Twenty-nine (29) people registered for our pit stop. Snacks, water, giveaways, and information were provided along with tee shirts.

We asked bicyclists to complete a survey regarding their bike commutes. Eighteen (18) surveys were completed and combined with the information received in the registration excel sheets we were able to glean interesting information about the participants and their bike rides. There were 12 men and 6 women. Except for one person, all others were at least 50 years old or better. All except two attendees were biking to work. Seven (7) commutes were within Prince George's County, five (5) commutes were between the county and DC, and five (5) were between the county and Virginia. Two (2) commutes were from Charles County to DC and one (1) was from Charles County to Virginia. One (1) commute was from Alexandria to National Harbor. One commute was from Fairfax County to DC, another was from Alexandria to Falls Church and one from NE DC to Arlington. Possibly the last three registrants went out of their way when registering for the Oxon Hill/National Harbor pit stop.

The shortest one-way commute was 3.5 miles and took 12 minutes. Two 20-mile one-way commutes and one 41-mile commute were reported, all with 3-hour travel times. Where bikes were parked at worked varied as 7 bikes parked at bike racks, 1 bike in a bike locker, 7 bikes

brought into offices, and 1 bike parked in a building stairwell. Most survey respondents had no problems to report.

Penn Quarter: The event was held from 7am to 9am. There were 74 registrants.

Port Towns at Edmonston: The Town of Edmonston sponsored the Port Towns Bike Stop at Veteran's Park on Bike to Work Day. We operated the stop from 6 to 8 a.m. and 4 to 6 p.m. We had 26 participants registered for the site. Our Police Department bike unit participated from 4 to 6 p.m.

Providence Community Center: The event was held from 7am to 9am. There were 31 registrants for the pit stop.

Purcellville: There were 12 registrants for the event's pit stop.

Reston: The event was held at the Plaza from 6:30am to 9:30am. There were 303 registrants for the pit stop.

Riverdale Park Station: There were 42 registrants for the event's pit stop.

Rockville: The Bike To Work Day event at Rockville Town Center on May 17th, 2024, was a resounding success, filled with energy, enthusiasm, and community spirit. Participants arrived bright and early, ready to kick off the day with a sense of camaraderie. Upon arrival, they were greeted with official Bike To Work Day shirts, hand sanitizers, rain ponchos, and an array of other goodies as tokens of appreciation for their participation.

This year, we were thrilled to welcome several first-time vendors to the event, including Gold's Gym and the Best Western Hotel. Their presence added fresh excitement to the festivities. Returning vendors, such as Onelife Fitness, Montgomery County Transit, and Care Some Sustainability, also made their mark, contributing to a diverse and engaging experience for all attendees.

The event was further elevated by the attendance of several dignitaries, including Councilmember Sydney Katz, City of Rockville Mayor Monique Ashton, and Phil McLaughlin, General Manager, Division of Transit Services. Their presence underscored the importance of the event and added a special touch to the day.

Exciting raffles were held, with participants winning a variety of bike-related prizes like locks and pumps. The highlight of the raffle was the giveaway of two Trek bikes which were won by two lucky participants.

Dawson's Market played a crucial role in keeping everyone refreshed, generously providing coffee and water for all attendees. The atmosphere was further enlivened by the DJ, whose music provided the perfect backdrop for conversations and interactions among participants.

Overall, the Rockville Town Center pit stop was a memorable event, offering participants the opportunity to engage with each other, explore the offerings of our vendors, and celebrate the joy of biking to work.

Rockville Fallsgrove: The Rockville-Fallsgrove 2024 Bike to Work Day pit stop enjoyed our second year at our new location at Thomas Farm Community Center, located in Fallsgrove Park and right on the Carl Henn Millennium Trail, in the heart of the Life Sciences Corridor. We got lucky with the weather for our early morning festivities and welcomed participants to join in the fun from 6:30-9:00 a.m. Many residents of the surrounding communities started their day with a short ride and stopped by on their way to work, or back home to start their day of teleworking. They came in waves throughout the morning, and included employees commuting to area businesses from as far away as Dupont Circle and Silver Spring. There were 222 registered and 136 in attendance. Casual bikers and cyclists, first-timers, and seasoned commuters --all gathered to celebrate one of their favorite activities and means of commuting, general travel, and exercise.

MCDOT Commuter Services and the City of Rockville co-sponsored the pit stop, as in years past and the MCDOT Greater Shady Grove TMD outreach team managed the event, with the help of great volunteers. Our DJ rocked the morning, while participants enjoyed yummy snacks and coffee from local businesses, picked up their Bike to Work Day t-shirts, towels, bicycle swag, and checked out the exhibitors with information, resources, and fun giveaways to share. Bike Center LTD performed bike safety checks and simple maintenance repairs, while County and City agencies hosted information tables, and OneLife Fitness trainers led multiple mini stretching sessions to get everyone in motion. Our emcees, including Gary Erenrich with MCDOT, engaged the crowd, introduced speakers, like State Delegate Lily Qi, and offered updates and information.

Our free raffle ran throughout the morning, and everyone had a chance to win really cool items from area businesses, while two lucky winners were selected in our random drawings for the beautiful Trek bikes, provided by MCDOT. There were big cheers all around and special thanks to our location host the City of Rockville's Thomas Farm Community Center --and for our volunteers, raffle donors, food sponsors and information exhibitors who contributed to making the event a great success. Rockville Twinbrook: The team setup in front of 5625 Fishers Lane with a DJ as well as photo booth with props. Coffee was provided along with juice, and water as well as bagels, granola bars and fruit. Tables were setup to distribute t-shirts and maps as well. It was a lovely day and the JBG SMITH team enjoyed partnering with GI Property Management once again to host the event.

Shaw: The event was held from 7-9 AM and had 123 registered Bike to Work Day participants. Snacks were provided by Fehr & Peers and two amazing volunteers helped pass out t-shirts and goodies to attendees. The highlight was an elementary school group meeting at our pit stop and then riding into school together.

Silver Spring: The 2024 Bike to Work Day Silver Spring pit stop was held at Veterans Plaza, and 360 individuals registered online. 235 individuals attended the event to enjoy music, raffles, a BTWD t-shirt, and other giveaways.

MCDOT staff managed the Veterans Plaza pit stop. Foundry provided contractor support, securing donors, sponsors, and exhibitors. Two additional volunteers helped at the giveaway tables. The Silver Spring Urban District(SSUD) Program Manager helped with the event layout while the indispensable SSUD Clean and Safe Team was on hand bright and early to assist with set up and with break down at the end of the event.

Raffles, Exhibitors and Grand Prize Winners: Commuter Services purchased two bicycles from Silver Cycles for the raffle. This year's winners were Jordan Gerth and Akilah Futch.

Strong Business Participation and Support: We had a lot of donated raffle items and refreshments that provided prizes for multiple raffles throughout the morning. Breakfast treats include bagels, fruit, muffins, and coffee. Downtown Silver Spring businesses, merchants, and non-profits who supported the event included The Blairs, Chik-fil-A, Einstein Bagels, Giant, Nando's Peri-Peri, Nike, Lime, WABA, CCI Health, Dave and Busters, Silver Cycles, Whole Foods, and others. All in One Entertainment was the DJ again this year for the event. In addition, other County and City agencies hosted information tables, along with other exhibitors.

Southwest Business Improvement District: The event was held at the BID from 8am to 10am. There were 69 registrants for the pit stop.

Springfield Metro: The event was held at the Springfield Metro Park from 6:30am to 8:30am. There were 54 registrants for the pit stop.

Springfield – South Run: The event was held at the South Run RECenter from 6:30am to 9:00am. There were 42 registrants for the pit stop.

Sterling: More than 100 cyclists visited the Sterling Pit Stop between 6:30 and 9:00 a.m. on Bike to Work Day. The event was held outside of the Sterling Ruritan Club, adjacent to the W&OD Railroad Regional Park.

Tents were hosted by Loudoun County Transit and Commuter Services, Trek Bikes Leesburg, Bike Loudoun, and Loudoun Water. A representative of Virginia National Guard hosted a table and visited with participants. A Loudoun County Transit bus was staged nearby to demonstrate the ease of placing a bike on a bus.

Participants picked up orange T-shirts and chose from a variety of giveaways. Loudoun County provided coffee, sports beverages, bananas, and a selection of pre-packaged snacks. The Loudoun County Board of Supervisors was represented by Vice Chair Juli Briskman (Algonkian District) who read and presented a Proclamation for Bike to Work Day. One participant experienced a flat tire just steps away from the pit stop. She referred to the Trek team as "her heroes." After a quick repair she was on her way to work. Tysons Corner: There were 51 registrants for the event's pit stop.

University of Maryland: The University of Maryland pit stop had a great turnout this year, with 74 registrants! BTWD 2024 fell on the last day of finals for the university, so the majority of participants were faculty/staff, but students who remained on campus visited our pit stop and had a great time! Vienna – Metro/Jim Scott Community Center: The second Bike-to-Work Day at the Jim Scott Community Center near the Vienna Metro Station was a huge success with 31 registrants and more than 45 cyclists who showed up!

Several walkers came by, too! Supervisor Dalia Palchik and her daughter, Sivan welcomed cyclists to our tents where officers from the Fairfax County Police Department and staff from the transportation departments of Fairfax County and Virginia answered questions and provided tips on safer cycling. We were grateful for their presence. We replenished water bottles participants brought and had t-shirts, bike lights, maps, fruit, snacks, bags, handouts, blinkers for bikes and many other goodies provided by our lovely partners to give riders to make this memorable day even better! We thank Sun and Surf Bike Shop who brought equipment and a stand to repair bikes and REI who also brought some fun goodies to provide our attendees.
